NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2023

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are a special purpose report prepared in order to satisfy the financial requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW, the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991.

The committee has determined that the association is a Not for Profit Entity and is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act NSW 1991 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements AASB 107: Statement of Cashflows AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates & Errors AASB 1048 Interpretation of Standards AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of noncurrent assets.

The following material accounting policies which are consistent with the previous period, unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis.

3 Key Management Personnel & Related Parties

All key management personnel and volunteers are not compensated. There are no related party transactions.

4 Fundraising Activities

Net fundraising is applied to the operational expenses of the Club in its core lifesaving activities.

Qualified Opinion

EDUCATION REPORT

Firstly, congratulations to all those who gained their awards this summer. To gain any award that keeps bathers safe on your watch is a grand thing. Well done.

After this we did a number of SRC and Bronze courses. We started off with many people doing first aid and then Advanced Resuscitation. 3 people namely Nathan Boscaro, Ian Graham and Janine Sager are all doing their Trainers Certificate. This is not a simple course and requires very involved and concise training and numerous submissions. We all should support and thank them, because without Trainers, we have no trained members.

Thanks must go to North Wollongong Surf Club for assisting train our members.

Thanks also is outgoing to Sue Martin of Sandon Point who assisted us with all our awards as without a Facilitator, we must not train and assess as we go. We need an independent Assessor to come in. Sue did this and has done this for the past 2 seasons. She is methodical and helpful.

I wish to remind members we have a season ahead of us. We all need to be aware of updates for season 23/24

On the IRB all switches will be standardized to ensure the throttle returns to neutral and reinforces that good maintenance is essential for all power craft. Be sure to look after the gear that looks after you. The power craft manual is currently under review so please if you have not done so for a while, read the exiting one now. The new power craft manual is going digital. There is now an emphasis on the dangers of over inflation and the importance of using ultra pulse oximetry before administering oxygen. There is also emphasis on the importance of heat illness based on the most effective ways to cool a patient rapidly. Be sure to check out the PSAR35 for more information.

Because of Covid, SLS want us to be across some of the crucial skills we should be aware of. SLS know that because of Covid there have been fewer opportunities to practice skills for defibrillation and all other lifesaving resuscitation skills. This is especially so for rescue breathes during resuscitation. They also feel we need to more familiar with hemorrhage control and the use of torniquets, and e-pens. They also feel we need to be aware of the treatment for asthma, bites and stings. What SLS are saying, is get some practice in. SLS are wanting us to practice communication skills during CPR. This is all about having a good and competent Team Leader. Check your gear before every patrol. Know who is assigned to do what. Then practice, practice, practice.

SLS are developing scenarios where you will be asked to make a decision and consider the consequences of that decision. You will be given choices at each step and responding to them. All members must complete the training for sexual harassment training. We all must complete this.

The new Silver Medallion Patrol Captains course has been released. Please read this on the Members Portal under eLearning. Become familiar with this type of training.

SLS want us to record all statistics correctly.

Finally, I am not standing for CTO again. I have been doing it for 11 seasons, along with Under 14 Age Manager. This is essential as it trains and eases the Nippers to enter patrol work and the senior club. It's time for me to pass on the training to another. Training needs a fresh perspective. I will still be here to assist the new person or persons. I am currently upgrading my own Cert IV qualifications to remain current. If you think keeping current for patrol work is onerous, become a Trainer as its never ending BUT highly rewarding. I will help the new person in every way that I can. It does not matter if you are not qualified. You can get there. It will take time, years in fact, but once you get there, these are nationally accredited qualifications that will help you greatly at our club and even in your work. It can even lead to a new career path in Training or some other service delivery. I will still be involved with Saturday Surfing as this has made huge difference in water skills and rescue capability. We do it all year round. If your board skills are a bit dusty, come along. Its great fun.

Finally thank you. I love our club, what we do, how we do it and it's been an honor to be part of Port Kembla Surf Lifesaving Club.

FIRST AID REPORT

It was a busy season in regard to the number of rescues undertaken, while first aid applications were mostly minor and undertaken with skill. Well done to all those who were involved in rendering first aid to members of the public.

Feedback from anyone requiring assistance was positive and with gratitude, as far as I am aware.

First aid equipment has been maintained and replenished as required.

My suggestion for improving our patrolling members ability to provide the optimum level of first aid and resuscitation response when required is a regimented approach to the checking of the equipment at the commencement of each patrol on duty. This would involve the checking of the oxygen cylinder and masks, that the defib is operational, and that all equipment is out on the table provided where it is ready for use. Because all patrolling members should make themselves familiar with the equipment at the beginning of their shift they would then be confident in its use when required. This short but important ritual should not be optional, but mandatory, with the filling out of a checklist each shift. Discussion concerning this matter will be open at the next general meeting of the club so all can add their opinion to how this procedure should be formulated.

Thank you to everyone for being exactly who we need on the beach - responsible life savers ready and willing to help all members of the public who turn to us for assistance.


